World Cafe Engagement Session on the Social Development Program This is an opportunity to share advice and input on how we can best meet the needs of people accessing social development programs on-reserve. The engagement process assists to identify gaps in current programming and considers best practices. Future community engagement sessions are proposed throughout 2010 and will include key informant interviews, surveys, and regional focus groups as part of the data collection.

National Child Benefit Reinvestment (NCBR), Training and Employment Support Initiative (TESI) and the Family Violence Prevention Program (FVPP) Application and Reporting Update

There are changes to the application and reporting requirements for TESI, NCBR & FVPP funding programs. This session will focus on three social development funding programs available in the BC Region and how to access these funds. There will also be information on who can provide support when developing your new or existing proposal applications.

On-site Compliance/Program Reviews - What you need to know

This session is for band social development workers who wish to minimize recovery of funding as a result of on-site compliance/ program reviews. The session will cover:

- Accountability - why we do Program Reviews
- Staged process - how we do Program Reviews
- Appeal Process - a new policy developed this year
- Most common issues - 3-5 examples of 'issues' we run into regularly
- Minimum requirement - what needs to be in the files to support expenditures (aka what you need to do to avoid recoveries)
